## Goss Park Project Continues

Many new events, exciting projects, and new business openings are increasing the spirit of optimism felt by those individuals taking an active part in the future of Paola.

Plans to replace the Cobra Head street lights that surround the downtown park, are moving forward. Electric replicas of Paola's original Wellsbach gas lamps will line the perimeter of the park, adding to the ambience of Paola's Historic District. The updated lighting will provide opportunities for evening events, shopping and dining on the square.

As early as 1858 our historic downtown park was the heart beat of Paola with local Indian tribes running horse races around the park and a variety of celebrations being held in the park. The park has remained the heart beat of Paola for 150+ years, and the downtown shopping area attracts visitors and families throughout the year. The recent gazebo and fountain restoration projects, funded by Mr. & Mrs. Jackson Goss, along with new businesses opening around the square, ensures that Paola's downtown will remain the heart beat of the community.

## Paola Art & Music

Paola is fast becoming known for the quality of artwork made available in at least three art galleries - DeMarie Gallery. For Art o'Sake Gallery and Gas Light Gallery & Studio. Other businesses, such as Molly's Table, Paola Free Library and Tre Sorella's Boutique participate in scheduled Art Strolls. These monthly events provide the opportunity for the community to enjoy the artwork of renowned artists and they give emerging artist a venue for their work.

## 2010 CHAMBER ANNUAL DINNER BIG SUCCESS

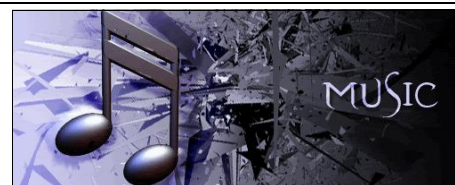

## Paola Free Library



The first library in Paola was founded in 1876 as the Paola Library Association, a stock company. In 1880 the library was housed in two upper rooms in the city building. Mrs. E.J.

Heiskell was the first librarian. In 1902 Martha Smith bequeathed \$10,000 for a library to be built in memory of her husband, John U. Smith. Plans were made, the agreement was signed by board members, and Fordyce Brothers were hired to build a one-story stone library building and basement which was built and paid for by the Smith estate bequest. The old frame building was sold and moved from the lot. The new brick and stone library was designed by George Washburn of Ottawa, one of Kansas' most highly regarded architects. Dedication was held April 10, 1906, and the new building was opened. A new addition was added and opened in 1985. The addition now houses the adult fiction books and current periodicals upstairs and a young children's area downstairs. With the help of many organizations and individuals the Paola Free Library continues to provide educational programs and material for the residents of Paola and the surrounding areas.
